GENERAL UPDATE

Moreover Anna N. and Laurenz organized the so-called "café intercultural", a place where our volunteers are able to interconnect with local people, for the first time. VISIT OF THE GERMAN RED CROSS

Half time! - It has already been 6 months since our 8 volunteers who have been sent by the German Red Cross (FreiWerk GmbH), joint Aldeas de Paz. That is why Frank Danscher the chairman of "FreiWerk" and Annelie Rochholl the responsible coordinator for voluntary services abroad, travelled to the Dominican Republic this month in order to hold an interim seminar.

For doing so, all our volunteers from the German Red Cross travelled to Las Terrenas, where the Seminar was given.

Besides lectures held on the history of the Dominican Republic and the principles of "FreiWerk", Frank Danscher and Annelie Rochholl analysed and evaluated everything that has happened in the past few months together with our volunteers. Additionally our volunteers possibilities after their stay with Aldeas de Paz were discussed.

Moreover the DRK representatives spent two days of their stay together with Julia and Manfred. In Particular actual happenings, problems and challenges, financial planning's, behavior in case of severe illness and the possibility of new volunteers being sent has been discussed. Additionally Frank Danscher and Annelie Rochholl where brought to several project locations and our volunteers apartments in order to be able to grant the best possible insight. After a successful week of evaluation our volunteers are now ready to start their second term.

The Café Intercultural is still in its baby shoes and may take some time until it is fully established, but we feel that it can become a valuable addition to the town's leisure time offers and create a platform for communication, interaction and plain fun.

I had numerous meetings with Manfred and Julia where they explained me what I should be careful with, how my donation is going to be used and what I will be responsible for. That has been the most important part for me, since I have planned my trip for a looooong time and really wanted to see how my contribution would benefit the kids as well as the organization. But not only the coordinator and founder involved me to the fullest, also my team asked me which tasks I would like to take on. Furthermore every volunteer recommended going on trips at the weekend. And yes, by all means: I enjoyed every single second
